





workshop's steps

Hands-on exercises to get to know the team better and encourage cooperation.

Approaching the world of fairy tales.

Getting familiar with the 'functions' of the fairy tale and the Magic Card.

Making fairy tales the Rodari way - techniques and games for making fairy tales with the group.

Italo Calvino and fairy tales for adults: making stories.







SEPARATING GROUPS

The groups are mixed with people from all organizations









GETTING TO KNOW THE TEAM 1st hands-on exercise:

Participants are paired up into couples with someone they don't know. They talk to each other for a while and then introduce their couple to the rest of the group.

After the introductions are over, we can ask the following questions:

Did you have difficulty finding questions?
Did you wish you had asked something else that you didn't ask?

Did you feel uncomfortable or comfortable with this encounter?

Do you think you did a good job introducing your couple? Did you forget to say something?
Why were some things easier to remember than others?

How did you feel when your couple introduced you to the group?
Did he remember everything you told him about you?







2nd hands-on exercise:

Participants discuss why they chose to participate in the workshop.

They then write on a piece of paper two wishes in relation to the group they have been divided into. They put the paper on a table, shuffle the pieces of paper and each person takes one and reads it.

This way they find out what the common goals and desires of the group members are, to see how they can do it better.







3rd hands-on exercise:

Participants are divided into couples. One is A and the other is B. In the first round A stands and B sits on the floor. They say how each one feels about the position they are in. They discuss a topic. After a minute they say again how they each feel talking from that position. In the second round they change positions and repeat the same process.

Then we all discuss together:

Did you feel uncomfortable or comfortable with the position we were in?

Did the change of the position affect what you were saying?







4th hands-on exercise:

Take two chairs and lean them back to back.

We have a couple discuss what we have done so far. We ask how they feel talking to each other in this way.

Then we move the chairs, moving them away from each other.

They discuss and then describe how they felt about communicating in this way.







CREATING STORIES

TEach group uses one of the books

We read parts of the book of our choice

and discuss the value of reading and literacy.

2 Each group uses the "Fairy Tale Cards" inspired from Gianni Rodari's "Grammar of Fantasy" to create a story

The stories are inspired from the books

We then present it to the other groups



Finally, each participant creates and presents his own story about an "Invisible City" inspired by Italo Calvino
